## **Facing Sample Instructions**

- 1. Cut 1 of each pattern pieces ON FOLD
- 2. Pin the facing to the neck line, matching notches and end points. Sew a straight stitch at a 1.5cm seam allowance from end to end and backstitch at each end.




3. Grade seam allowance to half the width on the facing ONLY

- Grading is to trimming your seam to various levels making layer of fabric a different width, this helps to reduce the bulk.)
- 4. Clip the seam allowance where it curves
  - > Clipping is cutting straight into the seam allowance to just before the stitching line. It releases the curve allowing the curve to sit flat when the facing is turned to the wrong side of the garment.




Clipping V > cutting V's at the cornes

- 5. Press the seam allowance towards the facing
- 6. UNDERSTITCH through the facing and both seam allowance only, close to the seam line. Stitch with straight stitch 0,A,2.5 use the center of the presser foot as your guide along the seam line. Make sure the seam stays "crisp" as you sew. Set your machine
  - Understitching is stitching a line close to the edge of a facing to keep it from rolling toward the outside.



7. Press the facing to the wrong side of the garment. The understitching should allow the facing to NOT roll up and out of the garment.
